Electronic elections – The Senate Elections Committee was asked to investigate the feasibility of conducting elections electronically. Concerns with paper ballots include: (a) cost of paper and copying; (b) lack of anonymity; and (c) inability to monitor multiple ballot submissions. In consultation with Chuck Ruch and Barb Kerns,

Qualtrics Survey Software was identified as a possible tool to conduct future elections.

Proposal - The Senate Elections Committee proposes to test the feasibility of using Qualtrics for elections by conducting the election of the faculty and the administrative representatives on the Contractual Arrangements Committee.

The benefits of conducting this election electronically include: (a) a smaller than normal set of electors (Only Senators can vote for representatives on this committee) and (b) all Senators will have had the opportunity to complete an election using an electronic ballot before discussing the issue on the Senate floor. Specific software settings will be used for the election to insure that only electors can submit ballots, that multiple ballots cannot be submitted by an individual, that search engines cannot index the ballot, and that the voting is anonymous.

A. 2012-2017 Strategic Plan.

Discussion – Brian Huggins informed Senate members that a final vote will be taken at the December Senate meeting. Any changes must come forward as motions to the Senate during the December 2011 meeting.

Charles Dannehl asked that a University Strategic Plan Committee Member (USPC) define *global citizen*, as the reference is used

throughout the proposed Plan. Numerous Senators offered a variety of definitions and interpretations along with the USPC's intent. Senators were asked to forward comments and suggestions to USPC regarding *global citizen*. USPC may, at the December Senate meeting, bring forward a motion to amend the circulated Plan.

Bernie Goitein asked, once adopted, will the USPC be involved in the implementation? Brian Huggins replied that the USPC will oversee the process which could include the appointment of an ad hoc committee. Further, multiple standing committees (e.g., Curriculum and Regulations, Contractual Arrangements, etc.) will be heavily involved in the implementation.

VIII. Other Business

- A. Report from Student Senator Bryant Au reported that: (a) A Credit Hours Survey is circulating, among students, to raise the credit hour cap to 16; (b) The Housing Survey received 2100 responses; (c) Speak Up was a success and a follow-up is being conducted on pertinent issues; (d) Senators are working with Susan Andrews (Associate Vice President for University Marketing) to identify a lyricist to compose an additional stanza to the BU Fight Song; (e) Storage for "out of region" students will be provided beginning Summer 2012; and (f) the Condom Resolution will be implemented in Spring 2012.
