

3. Global Warming: How Does It Work?

Why does carbon dioxide in the atmosphere heat, not cool, the Earth? How is the atmosphere opaque for some infrared wavelengths? Would reducing emissions now have much effect on Earth's temperature? Let's see what we can calculate without being climate scientists. Join us for a technical dive into the mathematics and science of global warming from an unbiased perspective. \$15 – Class instructor is Walter Urbaniak, a retired computer networking engineer with a personal interest in physics and a frequent OLLI instructor on various topics within that discipline.

4. Nationalism vs Globalism Version 2025

American politics is rife with debates about how involved the United States should be with other countries in the world. This class will explore two perspectives, including a discussion of definitions of terms, the benefits of each perspective, and the costs of each perspective.

January 8: Andy Diaz, Community Advocate for the North Valley, will share how he started Urban Acres in 2018, a small business focused on building up the community through urban agriculture, small business development, and commercial reinvestment. Through a partnership with St. Paul's Episcopal church, he recently launched Springboard Kitchen, a commissary space for rent, to foster the growth of food entrepreneurs in the Peoria community. January 15: Lee Maki, experienced University of Illinois Extension Master Gardener and Master Naturalist will discuss how the availability of healthy fresh produce is a challenge for communities

and how the Washington Food Pantry Garden volunteers have joined in site preparation, planting, weeding, and harvesting of fresh vegetables for local food pantries to help feed the hungry. This session will explore challenges faced, lessons learned, and cooperation with community partners. January 22: Ryan Foster, President of Pelia Academy / Budded Mattah Urban Agriculture. 7. Albert Einstein – His Life and Theories (for Dummies)

Nearly everyone has heard of Albert Einstein. But do you know his fascinating life story, and do you understand his key contributions to world history and science? Join Herb Kasube, Associate Professor of Mathematics Emeritus of Bradley University to learn more about the life of Albert Einstein. While minimizing mathematical formulas, Dr. Kasube will explore the history of Einstein from his early life, including the key influential people he engaged with and the revolutionary theories he developed, to his worldwide recognition for transforming our concept of the physical world and for changing the course of science.

1. Margaret Sanger, Rebel Woman

Meet Margaret Sanger, birth control pioneer, free speech advocate, author, and eugenicist. In the early 1900s when birth control was taboo, she urged women to reject their destiny of large families, poor health, and early death. This class will cover her early life and work and her challenge to the Comstock Act, which prohibited distributing birth control information through the mail. We'll also discuss her involvement in the eugenics movement, which tarnished her reputation as a game-changer for good. \$20 – Class instructor is Becky Sisk, Ph.D.

2. Nature in Your Home Landscape

In this class, we'll learn both the benefits and the devastating results of having either the good worms or the bad worms wriggling under your soil. What can one invading insect, or plant, or animal do to the natural world around us? Learn about some of the new invaders and some that have been in Illinois for decades and how they arrived here. We'll cover some of the history of these "invaders," their impact, and what we can do to control them. We'll also discuss the importance of pollinators' values to native plants and how to take steps to replace parts of lawn turf with native prairie plants.

\$20 – Class instructors are May Bach, Paul Resnick, and Lee Maki, all University of Illinois Extension Master Gardener/Master Naturalists.



3. The Early Universe

Ever wonder how the universe evolved after the Big Bang? In this class, we will learn about the first million years of the universe, the first five minutes, the first second, and the first trillionth of a second. Each step backward is more exotic and unfamiliar. We will learn about the Cosmic Microwave Background, the Dark Ages, Big Bang Nucleosynthesis, Baryogenesis, and Cosmic Inflation. Last year's course on "Expansion of the Universe" is useful and is available on YouTube, but not a prerequisite.

4. Medicare - New and Improved & How Will It Work For You?

The 2025 season will start January 6 and last for two months. Judy Helm will Zoom from her New Orleans home (also the den for Krewe de Jeanne d'Arc) during February. You will learn about the history and evolution of Mardi Gras and vicariously experience Mardi Gras through photos, videos, and interviews. 
The OLLI Mix & Mingle is a great way to meet new people in a casual environment.

The height of global scientific inquiry during the medieval era was the House of Wisdom, a.k.a. the Great Library at Baghdad. Class participants should obtain and read *The House of Wisdom*, by Dr. Jim al-Khalili, a British-Iraqi theoretical physicist and broadcaster.
