1. **What did your ancestors die of? – The World's Great Epidemics** – Joseph Dean, retired pathologist and associate professor at U of I School of Medicine, will present an insightful recounting of the major disease killers of the past centuries. (N)
2. **The U.S. Supreme Court** – LeAnna Grimsley, local attorney, will give a review of U.S. Supreme Court cases in 2001. (N)
3. **Mystery Short Stories** – Read and discuss short stories in the genre of British and American with Wilson Schroeder, a life-long enthusiast of mystery stories. (N)
4. **Computers for Scaredy Cats** – Sue Manley, Program Director in Continuing Education, will explore basic computer terminology, how a computer works, how to get started, how to purchase a computer and more! No previous experience necessary. (R)

5. **Voices of Peoria's Greatest Generation II** – Hear gripping stories from WWII veterans: a POW in Siberia; flying the Hump; fighting in the Battle of the Bulge; a pilot on air craft carrier Lexington; and more. (NM)
6. **Introduction to Islam** – Get an introduction to the religion of Islam, its principles, history and traditions. Bashir Ali, President of Muslim Education and Community Association of Peoria, will also explore the development of Islam in America. (R/NM)
7. **Othello: Conflict Between Good and Evil** – Peggy Carter, retired Bradley English professor and department chair, will compare Shakespeare's original text and modern film versions. Members should read the play and bring a copy to class. (N)
8. **Windows - Level III** – Sue Manley will extend your knowledge of the Windows operating system: shortcuts, adding and removing programs from computer or Start Menu. Learn how to set up hardware and deal with viruses. Advanced level class. Prerequisite: Windows - Level 2. No exceptions. (R)
