1. **If Our Bodies Came with Owners Manuals: Balance in Physical Functioning**—Bradley Music Specialist Molly Sloter offers ideas for understanding and practicing the release of muscular tension arising from habitual over-contraction of muscles. (RI/RC)
2. **Peoria Reads!**—This class will launch the Peoria Reads 2003 program with an overview of the "One City, One Book" national project. We'll read and discuss the 2003 selection, *The Reappearance of Sam Webber*, by Robert Scott Fuqua. Leaders include Roberta Koscielski, Maggie Nelson, and Nancy Rakoff. (NI/NC)
3. **The Louisiana Purchase: The Land of the Imagined and Redefined America**—Enjoy a blend of fact and mythology, learn about the circumstances surrounding the Louisiana Purchase and how it changed America. Join Junius Rodriguez, Eureka College Associate Professor of History, in looking at this historic event in its bicentennial year. (RI/NC)
4. **Selective Searching**—Jon C. Neidy explores searching on the World Wide Web. We will discuss and explore the differences between a search engine and a directory, learn concrete searching skills. We will also establish a procedure for evaluating the validity of a website. Prerequisite: (No exceptions, please.) *Wandering the World Wide Web*. (RI/RC)

9. **Choral Masterworks II**—John Jost, Bradley Music Professor, provides the opportunity to listen and become better acquainted with masterworks of choral music of the Baroque, Classic, Romantic and Contemporary eras. (RI/NC)
10. **Current Topics in International Trade**—Jim Foley and Dave Williams, Bradley international trade specialists, will use new materials to look at U.S. trade and our relationships with other countries. (RI/NC)
11. **Exploration of Art**—Join staff from the Peoria Art Guild in this enigmatic exploration of art. As the oldest community arts organization in Illinois, the Peoria Art Guild has been instrumental in the development of arts programming and exhibitions in downstate Illinois. Register for the class to learn the specifics. (NI/NC)
12. **PowerPoint Presentations**—Jon C. Neidy, Assistant Director of Continuing Education, explores presentation design, templates, adding graphic elements, transitions, aesthetics, and presentation style in Microsoft PowerPoint. Prerequisites: (No exceptions, please.) Familiarity with the World Wide Web, the Windows operating system, and word processing. (RI/RC)

7. **You Ate What!?!**—Are the foods you eat safe? Come and discuss with Joseph Dean, retired pathologist, the safeguards and threats to our food supply. (RI/NC)
8. **Scaredy Cats**—Sue Manley, Program Director in Continuing Education, explores basic computer terminology: what a computer is; how it works; how to get started; how to purchase a computer and more! No previous experience necessary. (RI/RC)

13. **Ireland**—Learn about Ireland's national treasure, the illuminated c.800 CE *Celtic Book of Kells*. Listen to the tin whistle and the bodhrán. Look at the Irish Sea, Dublin, and Ceanannas Mor (gaelic for Kells), with Phyllis Kells, Art MA & English MA. (RI/RC)

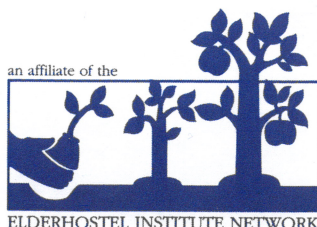
